In this webinar, Dr. Haggarty describes the planned research of a library of approximately 100 psychoactive plants and fungi, curated by the late Dr. Richard Evans Schultes, Harvard Professor and a founding father of the field of ethnobotany. Dr. Haggarty demonstrates how the knowledge from this research will have the potential to give rise to new therapeutic psychedelics and how patient-derived and other cellular models can be used innovatively for the discovery of precision medicines targeting neuroplasticity.
